



# Shrug and Slouchy Beanie

**LOOM:** 'Premium' Chunky Round Knitting Looms, 3 looms used, 48, 36 and 24 peg.

**YARN:** Approx 300-500 yds of Super Bulky weight merino wool yarn. Malabrigo Rasta in Pearl Ten was used in sample (4 skeins for size M). 90yds (82m); 150g (5.25 oz).

**NOTIONS:** Knitting tool, tapestry needle

**GAUGE:** 5.5 sts x 8 rows = 2"

**SIZE:** Hat fits up to 21" circumference head. Shrug sample shown is a size M, to make larger, simply knit a longer body. Instructions show the inches required for the following sizes S (M, L, XL)

## ABBREVIATIONS

Approx=approximate

k=knit stitch. May substitute with u-stitch.

p=purl stitch

st(s)=stitch(es)

rnd(s)=round(s)

yo=yarn over (ewrap empty peg)

k2tog=knit two stitches together (a decrease).

Move stitch from peg on the right to the peg on the left. Peg on the left has 2 loops on it, when working the peg, treat both loops as one.

## INSTRUCTIONS

### SLOUCHY HAT

Using the Orange, 48-peg loom, cast on 48 sts, prepare to work in the round.

**Rnd 1-8:** \*k2, p2; rep from \* to end.

**Rnd 9:** k to end of rnd.

**Rnd 10:** \*yo, k2tog; rep from \* to end of rnd.

**Rep Rnds 9-10:** until item measures approx 7.5 inches from cast on edge.

Remove all stitches to a piece of scrap yarn.





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Place all stitches on the 24-peg knitting loom (the smallest one)—2 stitches per peg.

**Next 3 rnds:** \*k2, p2; rep from \* to end.

Bind off with modified gather removal method.

Weave all ends in.

### SHRUG

Using the white, 36-peg loom, cast on 36 sts, prepare to work in the round.

**Rnds 1-12:** \*k2, p2; rep from \* to end. You will continue working in rows (back and forth on the loom).

**\*Next row:** k to end of row.

**Next row:** p3, \*yo, k2tog to last 3 pegs, p3. \* Repeat last 2 rows (from \* to \*) until item measures approximately 20 (24, 28, 32) inches from the beginning of the rows section.

Continue working in the round as follows:

**Next 12 rnds:** \*k2, p2; rep from \* to end of rnd.

Weave in all ends. To open the lace, steam block.

Note: To work the item longer work more rows, the section from \* to \*. Note, working more rows will require more yarn.
